The board views the education of students as a cooperative effort among W.A. McCreery Elementary School, parents and community.</p> <p>In compliance with federal law, Marion Center Area School District and parents of students participating in Title I programs at W. A. McCreery Elementary School shall jointly develop and agree upon a written parent involvement policy. Delegation of Responsibility</p>	<p>The Board shall adopt and distribute the parental involvement policy, which shall be incorporated into the district's Title I plan and shall be evaluated annually, with parental involvement.</p> <p>The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the district's Title I parental involvement policy, plan and programs comply with the requirements of federal law.</p> <p>The building principal and/or Title I staff shall provide to parents/guardians of students participating in Title I programs:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <p>4. Guidelines 20 U.S.C. Sec. 6318</p>	<p>An annual meeting of parents/guardians of participating Title I students shall be held to explain the goals and purposes of the Title I program. Parents/Guardians shall be given the opportunity to participate in the design, development, operation and evaluation of the program. Parents/Guardians shall be encouraged to participate in planning activities, to offer suggestions, and to ask questions regarding policies and programs.</p> <p>Title I parents at W. A. In addition to the required annual meeting, additional parent meetings shall be held at various times of the day and evening. W. A. McCreery Elementary School will also provide, if requested by parents, opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible. At these meetings, parents shall be provided:

1. Information about programs provided under Title I.
2. Description and explanation of the curriculum in use, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.
3. Opportunities to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children.
4. Opportunities to submit parent comments about the program to the district level and have input in the parent involvement policy.

If sufficient, Title I funding may be used to facilitate parent attendance at meetings through payment of transportation and child care costs to enable parents to participate in school-related meetings and training sessions.

Opportunities shall be provided for parents to meet with the classroom and Title I teachers to discuss their child's progress at different times of the day to accommodate parent schedules.

Parents/Guardians may be given guidance as to how they can assist at home in the education of their child.

School-Parental Compact

Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child’s achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held as a district level meeting where this compact is reviewed, at building level Parent advisory Council Meetings held annually, as well as at building level parent open house and/or workshops.d. Provide parents reasonable access to staff before or after school to meet, as well as by telephone for a conference.e. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child’s class, and to observe classroom activities.
